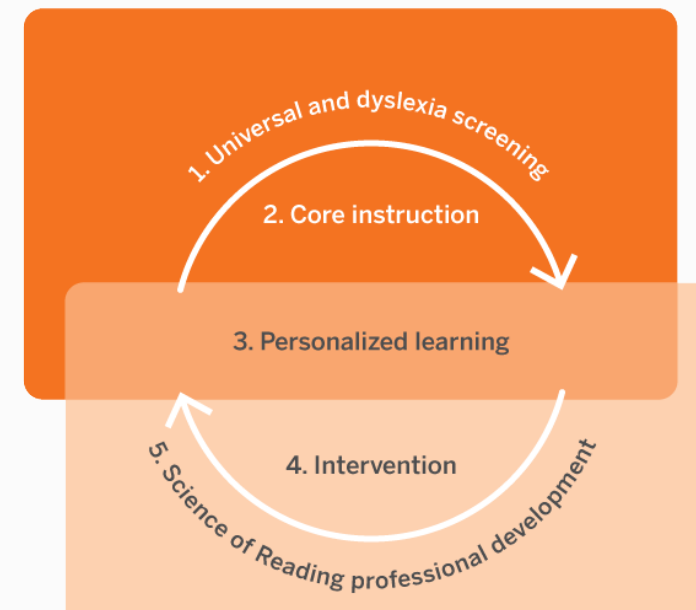
MTSS is a framework that supports decision-making for all students based on research and the constantly evolving needs of students and schools.

An effective MTSS framework requires collaboration from all stakeholders, such as teachers, administrators, and caregivers, to ensure that students have access to the right instructional support at the right time.

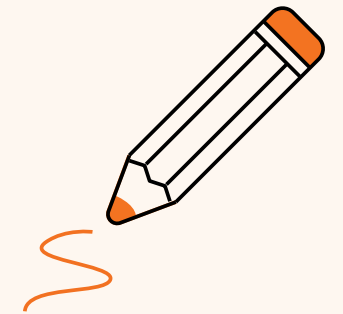

A multi-tiered system provides increasing levels of support for students when they are needed.

Implementing evidence-based instruction and interventions with fidelity improves outcomes for all students.

A focus on outcomes for all students, not just those struggling, ensures equitable access to high-quality instruction.

Frequent collection and interpretation of high-quality data is essential to identify student needs, monitor progress, and guide decision-making.

Universal screening and progress-monitoring data are used to evaluate the effectiveness of all tiers in a system of support, in addition to identifying students at risk.

MTSS focuses on prevention first, to reduce the need for intervention later.
